the drains that were in poor condition, were fixed. In addition, Jacques turned his considerable problem-solving skills and built a new outdoor sink for the team to wash the huge pots that we use in the kitchen. This has been a great help – as the previous arrangement was not ideal.



Repairs will still be needed to our aging storage cupboards, and it is likely that we will need to replace our old fridge. We look forward to getting these done soon – but as with the above-mentioned repairs, these will need to be paid for over and above our running costs and we are still looking for additional funds for this work.
